Our Participants

- 310 mothers of children with Down syndrome
- Ages 21-79 yrs
- Children aged 1 month 52 yrs.
- Recruited via Down syndrome support groups online



Materials

127-item survey administered via Qualtrics

Narrative:

Please describe how you received your son/daughter's Down syndrome diagnosis in as much detail as possible.

Please include as many details as you can including the date of the diagnosis, day of the week, time of the day, location, the weather, and clothes you were wearing.

Describe the people involved along with your thoughts and emotions.

There is no word limit for this response.

Sample Narrative Responses

"We were offered zero assistance, information, education or resources after that pediatrician left the room. I couldn't even cry because I wasn't so much upset as I was angry."


Alternative Measures for a FBM Talarico & Rubin (2007)

FBMs differ from regular memory by their phenomenological properties:


Recollection

Flashbulb memory checklist scores




Using the FBMC checklist, 78% of all narratives qualified FBMs


The pattern is similar for TR scores

FBM Category by Time Since Diagnosis



Some Preliminary Findings...

- Mothers with strong FBMs were less likely to report the birth of their child as a positive experience
- Mothers who received a prenatal diagnosis were more likely to report the birth of their child as a positive experience
