The Sergeant at Arms should be seen as an extension of the presiding 13 Whereas: chair of the Senate, but not hinder the power of the Chair. 14 The Sergeant at Arms is not a mandatory Senate office and would only 15 Whereas: be put into effect when deemed necessary by the Chair. 16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE SENATE OF THE STUDENT Therefore: 17 GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION IN REGULAR SESSION 18 ASSEMBLED, THE FOLLOWING 19 Add section 303.001 under Senate Offices, which will read, "The 20 **Section I:** presiding chair of the Senate has the authority to appoint a Sergeant at 21 Arms prior to or during a senate session. The powers of the Sergeant at 22 Arms should include, but are not limited to, the following:" 23 303.001a shall read, "The Sergeant at Arms will be an extension of the Section II: 24

presiding chair of the Senate. At the direction of the Chair they have the

authority to bar the doors for the purpose of maintaining quorum. The 1 Sergeant at Arms has the ability to verbally reprimand and/or remove 2 Senators and/or members of the gallery from the Senate chamber.
